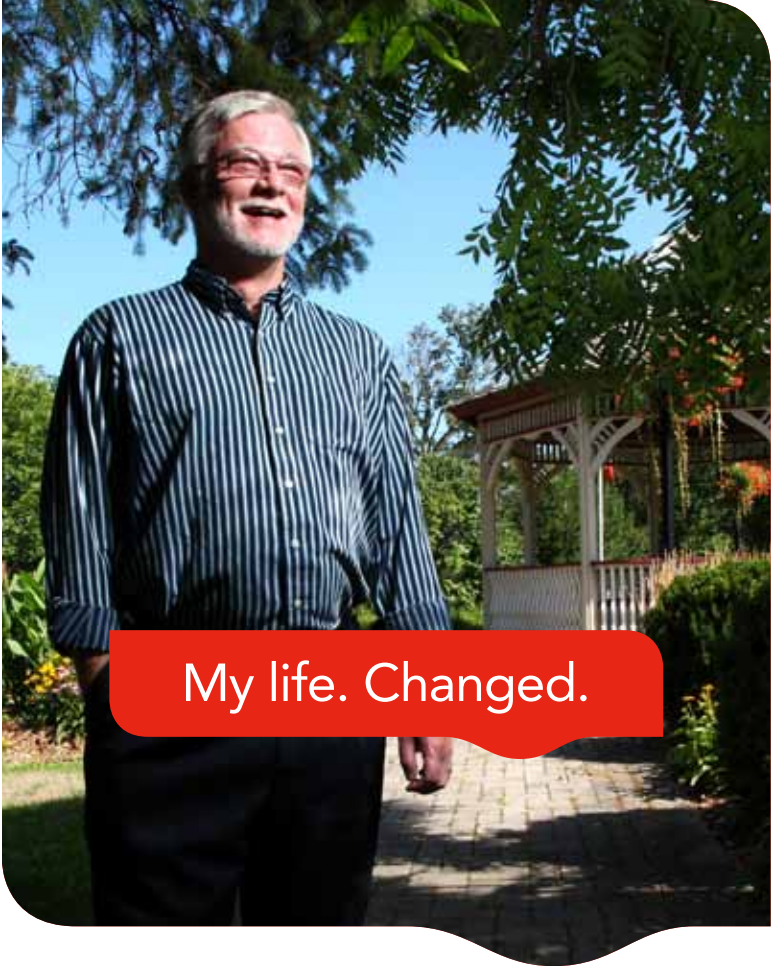

## Preface

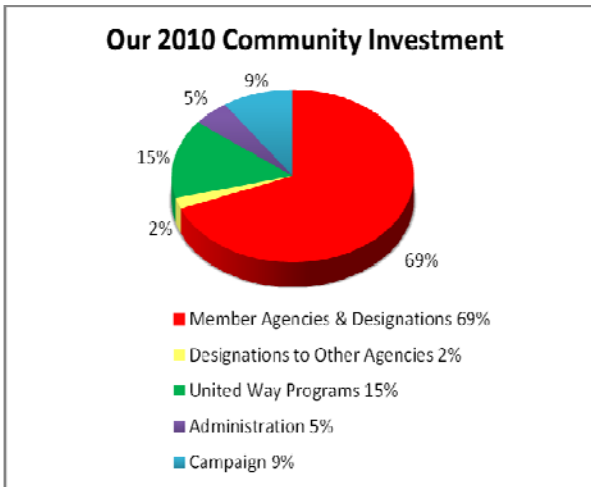
